

following names have been variously extracted from the original Toowong Cemetery records, the Queensland State Archives cemetery records, the Brisbane City Council grave location search, and directly from tombstones.⁶¹ Joan Ainsworth's list of monumental inscriptions (1988) facilitated the identification of the occasional grave. Our list is by no means exhaustive, but does represent the vast majority of Chinese buried in the cemetery. Some of the names listed may belong to people who were not fully Chinese or were European women married to Chinese men. Names in square brackets are renderings by Vivian Chen and Anne Lin.⁶²

Since no systematic romanization was adopted when the names of the deceased were transcribed, some of them are to be found variously reported in other contexts. Not only, but one person could go under a number of aliases. What is more, a name that looks or sounds Chinese may not necessarily be so, and we apologize to anybody whose non-Chinese relatives may have inadvertently been included here. Another possible source of error is the sometimes baroque handwriting of those compiling the registers and/or transcripts, which makes it very difficult to distinguish the letters. Matters are further complicated by divergent data obtained from the different sources. We find, for example, that while the headstone of Fei Hai Ket states that he died on 6 October 1946, the cemetery records state that he was buried on October 5, that is a day before he died. Hopefully, however, every effort having been made to avoid inaccuracies, our list will be of assistance to those searching for their Chinese ancestors and those interested in the history of Chinese immigrants and of Queensland in general.

For ease of consultation names are listed here in alphabetical order rather than according to year of burial. Some inversion of first names and surnames has been inevitable and for the sake of convenience the 'Ah' names have generally been treated as surnames. Where details of a burial are not shown, these are either unknown or are in need of further research.
